

# FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S OFFICE

Hello to the Rosebud Secondary College community. Once again the school has been hosting a wide range of activities for our students. We have had Outdoor Education camps, Literacy and Numeracy Day for Year 7, Science activities and Book Week events including the "Living Book" program.

A major change being introduced next year is a 1:1 computer program at Year 7 & 10. The ICT Action Team has been examining this during the year and has recommended a device and rollout program for 2015. This will be extensively advertised next term for incoming Year 7 students and will include information nights. **There will be an information night for current Year 9 and 8B students on Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> September.** The device will operate in a standard laptop format but can also be used as a touchscreen tablet due to it folding flat. It is estimated the device will start at \$725.00 with two models offered. The second model will be targeted towards students completing multimedia subjects in their senior program. This device will cost about \$880.00. The College will phase in the 1:1 program across all year levels over a three year period. Ordering will be done directly with local computer supplier EduNet via an ordering portal and there will be a variety of payment terms parents can use. All devices will be loaded with the EduStar image giving access to a range of software including Microsoft Office.

On Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> I attended my first Presentation Ball at the Chelsea RSL and we have the next ball this Friday. This was a wonderful event for our students and their families and it was great to see our students presented on the night. I would particularly like to thank Robyn Van Lieshout and the organising committee for all their hard work in making this happen. I would also like to thank Roger Anderson and the music staff and students who played so brilliantly on the night. It was a night to remember for our community.

It has been a particularly busy few weeks with many activities occurring across the school. Last week we held Book Week and I was personally involved in the "Living Book" program which ran over two days. This was a fantastic opportunity to speak to the students about my experiences and background. There were a great range of "Living Books" each day and I'm sure many of the students walked away inspired by the program. I would like to thank Sam Jeacle and the Library team who organised this event. Earlier in the week we had visiting author Hazel Edwards speak to our Year 7 students and local primary school students. Hazel gave students a great insight into the work she does in creating her characters and stories.

On Friday we held our Literacy and Numeracy Day with many staff and students dressed for the event. I will never forget Mrs Scholefield dressed as Count Dracula and Mr Seletto as Dumbledore! This was a great day for students to really engage in their learning while having fun. I would like to thank Mrs Schofield and staff involved on the day.

## **Deakin University Food Knowledge and Choices Research Project**

Rosebud Secondary College is participating in a new survey study by researchers from Deakin University. The study will consist of a once-off, 20-30 minute survey exploring student's food-related knowledge, eating patterns and choices, and body image. This study will also explore student's understanding of the relationship between food and health and illness.

A letter explaining the study will be sent home to parents/carers. If parents/carers agree for their child to participate, they will need to sign the parental consent form and return it to the school. Only students who have parental/guardian consent will be able to participate.

This research will give the school and the researchers a better understanding of the eating behaviours, body image, nutritional and food knowledge of students. (Deakin University)

Rosebud Secondary College supports this valuable research as the information gathered helps the college to better meet the educational needs of our young people.

# Careers Corner

## Important Information about VET in 2015

With the Course Counselling process nearing completion across Years 9 -12, this is a reminder notice to all students who will be in Year 10, 11 and 12 in 2015, about the enrolment requirements for VET (Vocational & Education Training).

All students who are planning to include an **Internal VET** (offered at Rosebud Secondary College) **OR** planning to enrol in an **External VET** (a program run at another location or by a specialist Training Organisation) should have handed in an extra **Expression of Interest Form** into the Careers Office.

**VCAL students are also part of this enrolment process, including Year 11 students proceeding into Year 12 VCAL.**

**Internal VET**- a grey coloured form

**External VET** – a cream coloured form

**Note:** The only Internal VET Programs offered by Rosebud Secondary College are:

- ◆ Certificate II in Creative Industries
- ◆ Certificate III in Media
- ◆ Certificate III in Sport & Recreation
- ◆ Certificate II in Information, Digital Media & Technology

A **\$50 deposit should also have been paid to the College Cashier.** Over the next 10 -14 days all VET Expression of Interest Forms will be processed and a letter sent home via mail to students who have submitted a form outlining the costs of their chosen program and the payment dates and options.

**Students will NOT be enrolled in any VET program unless they have submitted an Expression of Interest Form and made the payments outlined in the letter.** The information on the Expression of Interest Forms is essential, as all enrolments are completed through software programs or online portals.

**Extra Expression of Interest Forms are available from The Careers Office if required.**





It was a great day for all who attended. Students rotated through five different Numeracy and Literacy themed activities and challenges, including a sports challenge.

A conversation could change a life.

RUOK? Day is a national day of action held annually to encourage and empower all people to regularly and meaningfully ask 'are you ok?' to support those struggling with life.

**RUOK? Day** this year will be on **Thursday the 11<sup>th</sup> September**.

It will be recognised at our school so that we encourage each other to enjoy positive mental health, with 2 themes this year:

1. ways we look after each other and ourselves, and
2. Knowing where you can seek help or support.

This year we can share this information with family, friends and colleagues on **RUOK? Day** to help each other through life's ups and downs.

As part of this day students are being invited to **wear a Splash of Yellow** – this means students (and staff) at the college can **wear an item of yellow clothing or a yellow accessory** to the normal school uniform. 

## Preparing today's students for tomorrow.


