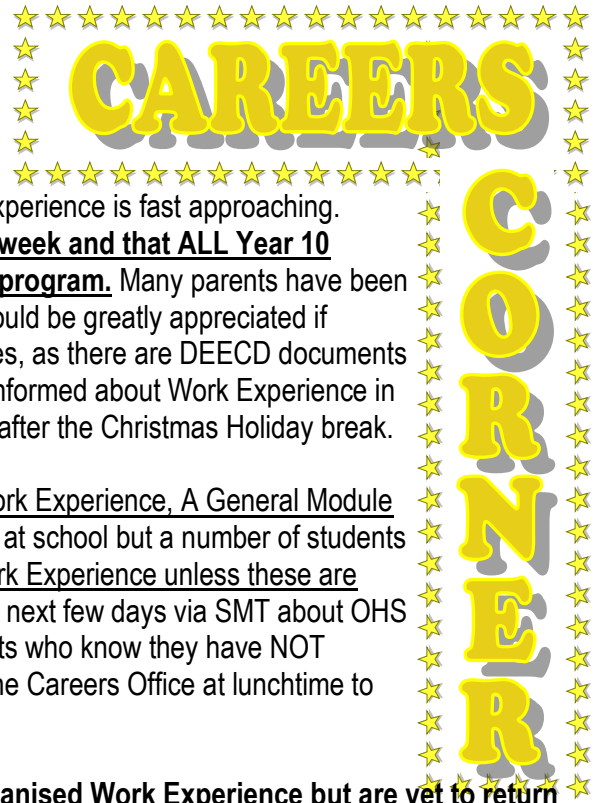

YEAR 10 WORK EXPERIENCE **16th – 20th MARCH**



There are still a number of Year 10 students who have not organised a Work Experience placement and the week of Work Experience is fast approaching. **A reminder that normal Year 10 classes will not run during this week and that ALL Year 10 students are expected to participate. There is not an alternative program.** Many parents have been contacted over the last week via phone, with messages left and it would be greatly appreciated if parents could help to encourage their students to organise themselves, as there are DEECD documents to be signed prior to commencing Work Experience. Students were informed about Work Experience in November 2014 and have been reminded constantly since returning after the Christmas Holiday break.

Students are also required to complete two OHS modules prior to Work Experience, A General Module and an Industry Specific Module. Both of these have been organised at school but a number of students have still not completed them. **Students will not be able to attend Work Experience unless these are completed.** If parents could be alert to messages sent home over the next few days via SMT about OHS modules and help their students to complete the online tests. Students who know they have NOT completed these OHS modules are more than welcome to come to the Careers Office at lunchtime to seek help.

There are also a large number of Year 10 students who have organised Work Experience but are yet to return the necessary signed paperwork, so if this could be attended to as quickly as possible it will help The Careers Office to finalise arrangements.

Congratulations to the 18 Year 10 boys who completed the one day CIC training on February 11th and now hold a White Card enabling them to undertake Work Experience and Work Placement on designated building sites.

SECONDARY SCHOOLS TAX FILE NUMBER (TFN) PROGRAM

Many families will have had students who have applied for their TFN through the school as part of this program. We have received notification that the Secondary Schools Tax File Number (TFN) Program between the Australian Taxation Office and schools ceased from 31st December 2014.

Why was the program terminated?

The Australian Government is strengthening proof of identity (POI) processes through a standardised national approach for government agencies. The Secondary Schools TFN program does not comply with these guidelines which require sighting and verification of original proof of identity documents.

How can students apply for a TFN?

Applying online and presenting POI documents at a participating Australia Post Office is the fastest and most convenient way for students to get a TFN. More information on applying online can be found at **ato.gov.au** by searching for 'QC27248'

Students who are unable to visit a participating Australia Post office will need to complete the application form *Tax file number - application or enquiry for individuals form* (NAT 1432).

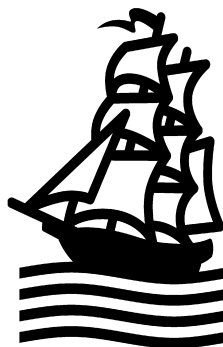

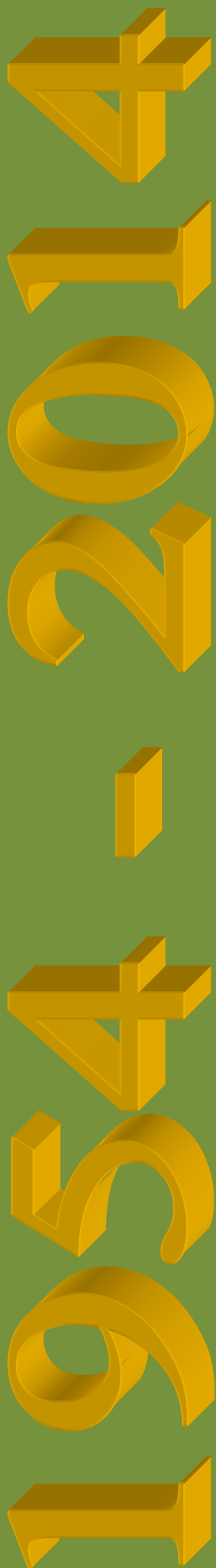
