EXTERNAL VET STUDIES TRANSPORT ARRANGEMENTS 2019

From 2019, Rosebud Secondary College will no longer be able to offer transport of any kind to external VET classes on a Wednesday afternoon. We understand that this decision is going to inconvenience some students and parents. Though we offered a transport service from the College to meet up with the 11.02am PENBus at Jetty Road, only 7 students took up this option.

If you are participating in an external VET not offered at Chisholm Peninsula Campus, please consider the following transport options:

The 788 bus service departs Boneo Rd/Pt Nepean Rd at 11.04, allowing students enough time to walk from the College at the beginning of recess time to the bus stop. This bus will take them to Frankston station via Mornington and Mt Eliza, allowing students attending VET classes at Mt Eliza Secondary College to attend. **There will be another connecting bus from Frankston Station that goes to EMC for VET classes held there but the timetable for this is not yet available.**

Private car - where a student has their probationary licence and is intending to drive themselves to their VET studies, they are not permitted to transport other students to that venue, in accordance with the Department policy.

Another option, car-pooling to reduce the number of times per term that a parent/guardian needs to provide transport.

Students needing to catch public transport will be allowed to leave the school at recess. If you decide to travel via private vehicle, students will be able to stay at school longer and attend their period 4 class, reducing the number of periods of their classes missed here at the College. We would appreciate you returning the form at the bottom so that we are aware of your transport decisions and students are accounted for.

WORK EXPERIENCE AT PENINSULA HEALTH 2019

Peninsula Health proudly host a number of secondary school work experience placements each year to provide local students with the opportunity to observe and learn about the range of career pathways in the health industry.

In 2019, Peninsula Health is pleased to accommodate a limited number of placements in a number of areas including Nursing, Allied Health, Admin, Midwifery, Paediatrics, Pharmacy etc.

To be considered for a placement in 2019, students are required to submit an expression of interest during one of the two intake periods (advertising December and May each year).

Placement opportunities for the March to June 2019 intake will be advertising on the Peninsula Health website Careers page <https://peninsula.mercury.com.au> and our Facebook page.

Peninsula Health will be advertising these Work Experience placements during December 2018.

Interested students are encouraged to submit their application for a placement online via the Peninsula Health website careers page.

Students will be required to complete an application form outlining their interest to pursue a career in health. Students will also be required to submit a CV which includes school subjects completed in 2019 and any academic achievements. To ensure that students complete their application correctly, they must read the instructions on how to apply as outlined in the advertisement.

As places are strictly limited, all applications will be reviewed and preference will be given to those who can demonstrate a strong interest to pursue a career in health and to those who are enrolled in appropriate subjects to support entry into tertiary study.

Peninsula Health encourages students and teachers to “like” the Peninsula Health Facebook page to ensure they are notified of when applications open.

RESULTS, VTAC CHANGE OF PREFERENCE AND 2019

As the Exam period for Year 12 draws to a close, it is important to understand what comes next when applying for university and TAFE positions. Please see the following timeline so that you are aware of important dates. Release of results: 14/12/18. Please ensure that you have downloaded the VCE results and ATAR to get your results quickly. They will also be emailed to you.

Change of preference period window: 14-19/12/18

Anyone who has to change their plans based on change of pathway direction, ATAR result or any other factor can take advantage of this time to revise preferences. All universities and TAFE's will have open sessions and course counsellors on line to help you with your decisions.

First round offers released: 16/1/19

Change of preference window for round 2: 17/1/19 – 25/1/19

Second round offers released: 4/2/19

Change of preference window for round 3: 5/2/19 – one day only

Third round offers released: 11/2/19

It should be noted that getting your preferences right in December is the most successful way to get the course you want. The number of offerings in round 2 and 3 is much smaller than in round one. Students should ensure that their first preference is the course that they really want to do and the other preferences are stepping stones to that career pathway, including diploma level options that can be a pathway through to a degree. Take advantage of the information here at school and also the assistance that the universities and TAFE's will provide. Please come and see us in the careers office for any assistance you require.

YEAR 10 WORK EXPERIENCE 2019

We have evaluated the work experience program and are intending to offer 2 possible windows in which to complete your work experience. These changes are designed to make it more flexible for students to find work experience in an industry that interests them and spread the load on local businesses. We have already started preparing the students with OHS education so that they are aware of the things they need to look out for when in a work setting and showing them how this fits in with the bigger picture of choosing a pathway in Year 11 and 12. All year 9 students are encouraged to start thinking about what they would like to try and then think about who could help make this connection within their family and friendship network. Petanque has also been taught during the last week. We really appreciate the efforts of the helpers with this game also. A touch of French culture on the Southern Peninsula.




