Please Note:

- Throughout the year, opportunities will be provided for students to participate in incursions and excursions to enhance the classroom program. Further information about these events, including associated costs, will be provided to parents/carers as these opportunities arise.
- CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the cost of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance will be paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. The annual CSEF amount per student will be: \$225 for secondary students.
- **You will be informed via Compass when CSEF application forms are available.**
- **Textbooks are supplied by the College book supplier, Rosebud Office Choice. Please see the textbook form enclosed for ordering.**
- **Parents may choose to provide or purchase some items themselves. If you choose to do this you must consult with the school first so that your child has the right items. There may be some items or services that you may not be able to purchase yourself.**
